CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS/CARERS AND VISITORS

Our school is at its best when parents and staff work together to make sure every child gets the most from their time here. By enrolling your child at Manor Beach you are agreeing to the expectations of the school. This 'Code of Conduct', drawn up by the Parents' Committee of the Governing Body, sets out what parents / carers and visitors can and should do to help create the right atmosphere. If anyone else takes your child(ren) to or from school, please make sure they know about these expectations.

Parents, carers and visitors are expected to:

- treat everyone involved in the school with respect
- co-operate with the staff for the benefit of children; this means supporting and encouraging them in their learning, especially home learning, and following school rules
- display positive behaviour on and around school premises
- talk with the headteacher or other staff if they have any genuine concerns or questions; the school will respond within 24 hours to arrange a mutually convenient time to discuss the concerns/issues.

Parents, carers or visitors must not:

- use offensive or inappropriate language such as swearing or racist/sexist comments, use aggressive hand gestures or act in an intimidating way on school premises
- engage in heated disagreements/conversations with other adults, especially within earshot of children, on school premises
- exhibit or threaten violence or physically punish children on school premises
- shout at a member of staff either in person or over the telephone; volatile behaviour will not be tolerated and staff reserve the right not to talk with you if you are abusive/aggressive
- approach someone else's child (or parent of the child) in order to discuss or chastise them because of the actions of the child towards your own child(ren) in school: if there is a disagreement, please get the school involved
- interfere or threaten to interfere with any school activities
- use Facebook or other social media inappropriately
- smoke (including e-cigarettes), consume alcohol or any other drug on school premises
- park on the yellow zig zag/double lines or across neighbours' driveways
- bring dogs (except assistance dogs) onto school premises
- ride scooters, bikes or skateboards on school premises; mobility scooters must be driven with care and not at speed.
- damage school property

We hope you agree these expectations and understand why the school may need to take action if they are not met. This might involve contacting the local authority and the police – and could even lead to individuals being banned from school grounds.
